### **TECHNICAL MEETING & INFORMATION**

#### **Technical Meeting**

There will be an official meeting of Chef d' Equipe /Coaches (Officials) on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July, at the Show Ground at 10:00am. The draw for horses, and to determine the jumping order for the first two days of competition will be done at this meeting. The National Riders will ride first in the first qualifying competition. The Foreign Riders will ride first in the second qualifying competition. In the final round of the competition, riders will enter in ascending order of their accumulated scores.

#### **Schooling of Horses**

Immediately following the Meeting, Foreign Riders will be given the opportunity to school their horses drawn, for a half (1/2) hour during which a maximum of six (6) fences may be taken, cross rails not counted. No riding of horses will be allowed by coaches.

### **Age of Riders**

**Junior** From the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 15 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

**Children** From the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14.

### **Description of Competitions**

Each National Rider will share his/her horse with a Foreign Rider. In the event that our National Riders outnumber Foreign Riders, there will be a draw to allow the Foreign Riders to ride a second horse. This will ensure that each horse is ridden in two rounds per day.

### **ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE & TRANSPORTATION**

Teams should arrive on Tuesday, July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011 and depart Sunday, July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2011 from Sangster International Airport, Montego Bay.

Transportation will be provided from and to the Airport on Tuesday and Sunday respectively, for riders, Officials and supporters. Riders and coaches are free, supporters will be charged at US\$40 round trip, Montego Bay to Ocho Rios return.

For departure July 11<sup>th</sup>, we are suggesting that you have a flight that does not depart too early, as the distance is 2 hours, plus you need to be at the airport 2 hours before departure.

Transportation will be provided for riders and Officials to and from the Show Ground, and for organized recreational activities.

### **ACCOMMODATION**

Accommodation for Riders, Coaches and supporters will be organised in a hotel in Ocho Rios when the Countries have confirmed by email that they are interested in competing at the show.
